In May 2018 I was employed by IASH at the University of Queensland as the Project Coordinator and one of the four Principle Investigators (PI) of the “After Science and Religion Project.” The other three PIs are Professor Peter Harrison (Modern History, University of Queensland), Professor John Milbank (Philosophical Theology, University of Nottingham) and Professor Tom McLeish (Physics and Natural Philosophy, University of York).

This project starts from Professor Harrison’s book *The Territories of Science and Religion* (University of Chicago Press, 2015) which shows that ‘science’ and ‘religion’ are not natural kinds, but have distinct histories where they have been shaped to perform differentiated functions within defined territories. This project has attracted outstanding philosophical theologians – John Milbank, Rowan Williams, Catherine Pickstock, Charles Taylor, David Bentley Hart, William Desmond, David C. Schindler, Michael Hanby and other luminaries – to work in conjunction with theologically literate scientist and historians – Tom McLeish, Peter Harrison and other luminaries – to re-think what science and religion themselves could be. The project gained initial funding, institutional support and participants in 2017, convened in Cambridge in Easter 2018, will convene again in 2019, and will conclude with two edited publications from participants and a monograph by myself in May 2021.
